Educational Talent Search is a federally funded TRIO program that has helped millions of young people across the United States achieve their educational and career goals. The Talent Search Program serves Boston Public School students at the following schools and locations:

- · Brighton High School
- · Community Academy of Science and Health
- Urban Science Academy
- West Roxbury Academy

Talent Search participants receive one-to-one advising to help them succeed in school and plan for college and career. Program participants can take advantage of services including:

- Support in Choosing and Applying to College
- Financial Aid Application Assistance
- Interactive Workshops
- · College Tours and Information Sessions
- Career Planning
- Academic Advising and Support
- · Paying for College
- · Scholarship Referrals
- Internship Referrals
- Mentoring
- · Skill-Building Activities
- Fee Waivers

Who May Participate?

High school students at participating sites are eligible to apply for the Talent Search Program. Students may be referred by counselors, teachers, or community agencies.

Parental Involvement is Encouraged

Students and their families can learn together. Attend workshops to receive assistance in completing college and financial aid applications, help in choosing a school, and access to resources.

The application process includes:

- · Meeting with a Talent Search Advisor
- Completing the Talent Search Application

Due to federal guidelines, household income and parental information is required. The completed application also requires the student's social security number (and alien registration number if applicable), and parental signatures.
